



As a philosopher, archivist, and historian, Mr. Henry's *Edward Leroy Tabler, A Remarkable Private in the Civil War and His "Old Pard" Edward Burns (1861-1863) Their Diaries and Letters*, offers a compilation of the History of the 51st Illinois Infantry, Company K through Tabler's daily entries and a companion diary of Tabler's "Old Pard" Edward Burns.

Tabler's family history is also Mr. Henry's history several generations removed. Observations of the author give a fuller picture of Tabler's personality and character. Being able to make Tabler's accounts of his Civil War activities public, was a labor of love for Mr. Henry, whose distant relative and his wartime friend come alive on the pages, some 160 years later.
